1. What is this product about?

The Fund is an open-ended fixed income fund, issued and managed in-house by the Manager. The Fund endeavours to provide regular and steady income distribution over the long-term.

This Fund is designed for retail investors who want exposure primarily to AUD-denominated assets, are relatively conservative with a bias towards receiving regular income and expect incidental growth in capital.

5. What are the possible outcomes of my investment?

The Fund is a fixed income fund that invests a minimum of 70% in AUD-denominated fixed income instruments, money market instruments and deposits, and a maximum of 30% in equities. The Fund's returns would to a great extent be linked to performances of the AUD fixed income market and Australian stock market. If both markets generally perform well, the Fund may reflect similar performance and likewise.

As opposed to the AUD Class where performance is from an AUD investor's perspective, Unit Holders of the RM Class will have to consider AUD/RM currency movements as it has a great deal of influence on final returns. The Fund's performance will also rely on the Manager's in-house expertise in managing the Fund to deliver better returns relative to its benchmark.

Investments in fixed income instruments, money market instruments and deposits are expected to generate consistent and regular income. Due to investments in equities, the Manager expects the Fund to also yield incidental growth in capital.

The asset allocation decision between fixed income instruments, money market instruments, deposits, and equities is decided after considering the fixed income and equity market outlook over the medium to long-term horizon. Please note that the capital and returns of the Fund are not guaranteed.

KEY RISKS

6. What are the key risks associated with this product?

General risks

- Market risk Market risk arises because of factors that affect the entire market. Factors such as economic growth, political stability
 and social environment are some examples of conditions that have an impact on businesses, whether positive or negative. Market
 risk cannot be eliminated but may be reduced through diversification. It stems from the fact that there are economy-wide perils, or
 instances of political or social instability which threaten all businesses. Hence, the Fund will be exposed to market uncertainties and
 no matter how many securities are held, fluctuations in the economic, political and social environment will affect the market price of
 the investments either in a positive or negative way.
- Manager's risk This risk refers to the day-to-day management of the Fund by the Manager, which will impact the performance of the Fund. For example, investment decisions undertaken by the Manager as a result of an incorrect view of the market or any non-compliance with internal policies, investment mandate, the Deed, relevant law, or guidelines due to factors such as human error, fraud, dishonesty, or weaknesses in operational process and systems, may adversely affect the performance of the Fund.
- **Performance risk** The performance of the Fund depends on the financial instruments that the Fund purchases. If the instruments do not perform within expectation or if there is a default, then, the performance of the Fund will be impacted negatively. The performance of the Fund may also be impacted if the allocation of assets is not properly done. This is where the experience and expertise of the fund managers are important and the risk on the lack of experience and expertise of the fund managers has been highlighted above. On that basis, there is never a guarantee that investing in the Fund will produce the desired investment returns or distribution of income.
- Inflation risk This is the risk that your investment in the Fund may not grow or generate income at a rate that keeps pace with inflation. This would reduce your purchasing power even though the value of the investment in monetary terms has increased.
- Loan / Financing risk This risk occurs when you take a loan/financing to finance your investment. The inherent risk of investing with borrowed/financed money includes you being unable to service the loan/financing repayments. In the event Units are used as collateral, you may be required to top-up your existing instalment if the prices of Units fall below a certain level due to market conditions. Failing which, the Units may be sold at a lower Net Asset Value per Unit as compared to the Net Asset Value per Unit at the point of purchase towards settling the loan/financing.
- **Operational risk** Operational risk is the risk of loss due to the breakdown, deficiencies or weaknesses in the operational support functions resulting in the operations or internal control processes producing an insufficient degree of customer quality or internal control by the Manager. Operational risk is typically associated with human error, system failure, fraud and inadequate or defective procedures and controls.
- Suspension of repurchase request risk Having considered the best interests of Unit Holders, the repurchase requests by the Unit Holders may be subject to suspension due to exceptional circumstances, where the market value or fair value of a material portion of the Fund's assets cannot be determined. In such case, Unit Holders will not be able to redeem their Units and will be compelled to remain invested in the Fund for a longer period of time. Hence, their investments will continue to be subject to the risks inherent to the Fund.

Specific risks

- Equity and equity linked instruments investment risk The buying and selling of equities and equity-linked instruments such as warrants (the word "equities" hereinafter is referring to the equity and equity-linked instruments") carries a number of risks. The most important being the volatility of the capital markets (of those tradable equities), the general insolvency risk associated with the issuers of equities, and/or the performance of the underlying equity that the equity-linked instrument is linked to. The value of equities depends on its growth and earnings potential, sound management, treatment of minority shareholders, as well as a myriad of other factors. Failure to achieve the expected earnings would result in declining investment value which in turn affects the performance of the Fund. This risk could be mitigated by diversifying the Fund's portfolio. The Manager will employ stringent stock selection criteria which would effectively filter its stock components to equities which can provide returns to the Fund in the form of capital gains and income.
- Credit and default risk Credit risk related to the creditworthiness of the issuers of the fixed income instruments and money markets instruments and the financial institutions where the deposits are placed (hereinafter referred to as "investment") and their expected ability to make timely payment of interest and/or principal. Any adverse situations faced by the issuer and/or financial institution may impact the value as well as liquidity of the investment. In the case of rated investments, this may lead to a credit downgrade. Default risk related to the risk of an issuer and/or a financial institution of the investment either defaulting on payments or failing to make



payments in a timely manner which will in turn adversely affect the value of the investment. This could adversely affect the value of the Fund.

- Interest rate risk Fixed income securities and money market instruments are subject to interest rate fluctuations (hereinafter referred to as "investment"). Generally, movement in interest rates affects the prices of investment inversely. For example, when interest rates rise, prices of investment will fall. The fluctuations of the prices of investment will also have an impact on the NAV of the Fund. This risk can largely be eliminated by holding the investment until their maturity. We also manage interest rate risk by considering each investment's sensitivity to interest rate changes. When interest rates are expected to increase, the Fund would then likely seek to switch to investment that are less sensitive to interest rate changes. For investments in deposits, the fluctuations in the interest rates will not affect the placement of deposits but will result in the opportunity loss by the Fund if the placement of deposits is made at lower interest rate.
- Currency risk As the investments of the Fund may be denominated in currencies other than the Base Currency, any fluctuation in the exchange rate between the Base Currency and the currencies in which the investments are denominated may have an impact on the value of these investments. You should be aware that if the currencies in which the investments are denominated depreciate against the Base Currency, this will have an adverse effect on the NAV of the Fund in the Base Currency and vice versa. You should note that any gains or losses arising from the fluctuation in the exchange rate may further increase or decrease the returns of the investment.

Currency risk at the Class level

The impact of the exchange rate movement between the Base Currency and the currency of the RM Class may result in a depreciation of your holdings as expressed in the Base Currency.

- **Country risk** Investments of the Fund in any countries may be affected by changes in the economic and political climate, restriction on currency repatriation or other developments in the law or regulations of the countries in which the Fund invests in. For example, the deteriorating economic condition of such countries may adversely affect the value of the investments undertaken by the Fund in those affected countries. This in turn may cause the NAV of the Fund and prices of Units to fall.
- Liquidity risk Liquidity risk refers to two scenarios. The first is where an investment cannot be sold due to unavailability of a buyer for that investment. The second scenario exists where the investment, by its nature, is thinly traded. This will have the effect of causing the investment to be sold below its fair value which would adversely affect the NAV of the Fund and subsequently the value of Unit Holders' investments in the Fund.
- **Regulatory risk** The risk that any changes in national, economic or foreign exchange policies or regulations may have an adverse effect on the capital markets and could sequentially have an impact on the investments of the Fund. To pre-empt and mitigate the impact of regulatory risk, the Manager will seek to keep abreast of regulatory developments that may affect the investments of the Fund.
- Distribution out of capital risk The Fund may distribute income out of capital. Such capital distributions represent a return or withdrawal of part of the amount of your original investment and/or capital gains attributable to the original investment and will result in a reduction in the NAV per Unit of the Classes and reduce the capital available for future investment and capital growth. Future capital growth may therefore be constrained.

RM Class

For the period 1 September 2022 to 31 August 2023, the Fund registered a -1.45% return compared to the benchmark return of 2.47%. Since commencement, the Fund has registered a return of 68.46% compared to the benchmark return of 61.21%, outperforming by 7.25%.

AUD Class

For the period 1 September 2022 to 31 August 2023, the Fund registered a 2.20% return compared to the benchmark return of 2.76%. Since commencement, the Fund has registered a return of 66.65% compared to the benchmark return of 46.70%, outperforming by 19.95%.

Please note that the fixed income portion of the benchmark was changed from previously the Australian 6-month Government Bond Price to currently the Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) Average Rate of Term Deposits (across all terms).

In our view, the Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) Average Rate of Term Deposits serves as a better indication for relative performance of the Fund's fixed income investments. The Australian 6-month Government Bond is not readily accessible to typical individual investors due to factors such as high minimum investment size and lack of dealers for Australian government bond sales to individuals.

As such, it does not clearly represent a suitable comparison for investors as a benchmark against the Fund's fixed income investments.

Alternatively, it is relatively easy for an individual investor to place Australian currency term deposits either onshore or offshore. As such, the Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) Average Rate of Term Deposits (across all terms) would serve as a better benchmark for the Fund's fixed income investment portion as it would provide a practical comparison against the Fund's fixed income investments. Through this benchmark, investors can determine if investing in the Fund has yielded better results or not than an investment which the investor could practically and readily perform themselves (i.e. placing Australian currency term deposits either onshore or offshore).

Please note that the change in the benchmark has no impact or change to the asset allocation or investment strategy of the Fund.

Basis of calculation and assumption made in calculating the returns:

The performance figures are a comparison of the growth/decline in NAV for the stipulated period taking into account all the distribution payable (if any) during the stipulated period.

An illustration of the above would be as follow:-

Capital return = NAV per Unit end / NAV per Unit begin – 1 Income return = Income distribution per Unit / NAV per Unit ex-date

Total return = Income distribution per Unit / NAV per Unit ex Total return = (1+Capital return) x (1+Income return) – 1

APPENDIX: GLOSSARY

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AUD	Means Australian Dollar.
AUD Class	Represents a Class issued by the Fund which is denominated in AUD.
AUD-denominated	Means Australian Dollar denominated.
Base Currency	Means the currency in which the Fund is denominated i.e. AUD.
Bursa Malaysia	Means the stock exchange managed or operated by Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad and includes any changes to the name or the operator of the Malaysian stock exchange.
Business Day	Means a day on which Bursa Malaysia and/or one or more of the foreign markets in which the Fund is invested in are open for business/trading.
Class(es)	Means any class of Units representing similar interests in the assets of the Fund although a class of Units of the Fund may have different features from another class of Units of the same Fund.
the Deed	Means the deed dated 11 February 2009, as modified by the Supplemental Deed dated 21 January 2010, the Second Supplemental Deed dated 21 February 2011, the Third Supplemental Deed dated 8 August 2011, the Fourth Supplemental Deed dated 18 January 2012, the Fifth Supplemental Deed dated 21 January 2013, the Sixth Supplemental Deed dated 27 June 2014, the Seventh Supplemental Deed dated 19 December 2016 and the eighth supplemental deed dated 5 October 2018 and the ninth supplemental deed dated 24 August 2022 relating to the Fund all entered into between the Manager and the Trustee.
deposit(s)	Has the same meaning as the definition of "deposit" in the Financial Services Act 2013. For the avoidance of doubt, it shall exclude structured deposit.
derivatives	Means a security where the price is dependent upon or derived from its underlying assets.
EPF	Means Employees Provident Fund.
EMIS	Means EPF Members' Investment Scheme.
the Fund	Refers to AHAM Select AUD Income Fund.
FYE	Means financial year end of the Fund which is 31 August.
long-term	Means a period of five (5) years or more.
Manager / AHAM / us / we / our	Refers to AHAM Asset Management Berhad.
Net Asset Value (NAV)	Means the value of all the assets of the Fund less the value of all the liabilities of the Fund at a valuation point; where the Fund has more than one Class, there shall be a Net Asset Value of the Fund attributable to each Class.
NAV per Unit	Means the Net Asset Value of the Fund at a particular valuation point divided by the number of Units in Circulation at the same valuation point; where the Fund has more than one Class, there shall be a Net Asset Value per Unit for each Class; the Net Asset Value per Unit of a Class at a particular valuation point shall be the Net Asset Value of the Fund attributable to that Class divided by the number of Units in Circulation of that Class at the same valuation point.
Prospectus	Refers to the prospectus in respect of the Fund and includes any supplemental or replacement prospectus, as the case may be.
Repurchase Charge(s)	Means a charge imposed pursuant to a repurchase request.
RM	Means Ringgit Malaysia.
RM Class	Represents a Class issued by the Fund which is denominated in RM.
Sales Charge (s)	Means a charge imposed pursuant to a purchase request.
SC	Means Securities Commission Malaysia.
the Trustee	Refers to TMF Trustees Malaysia Berhad.
Unit or Unit(s)	Means an undivided share in the beneficial interest and/or right in the Fund and a measurement of the interest and/or right of a Unit Holder in the Fund and means a Unit of the Fund and if the Fund has more than one Class, it means a Unit issued for each Class.
Units in Circulation	Means Units created and fully paid and which have not been cancelled. It is also the total number of Units issued at a particular valuation point.
Unit Holder(s) / investor(s) / you	Means the person/corporation for the time being who is registered pursuant to the Deed as a holder of Units, including a jointholder.
